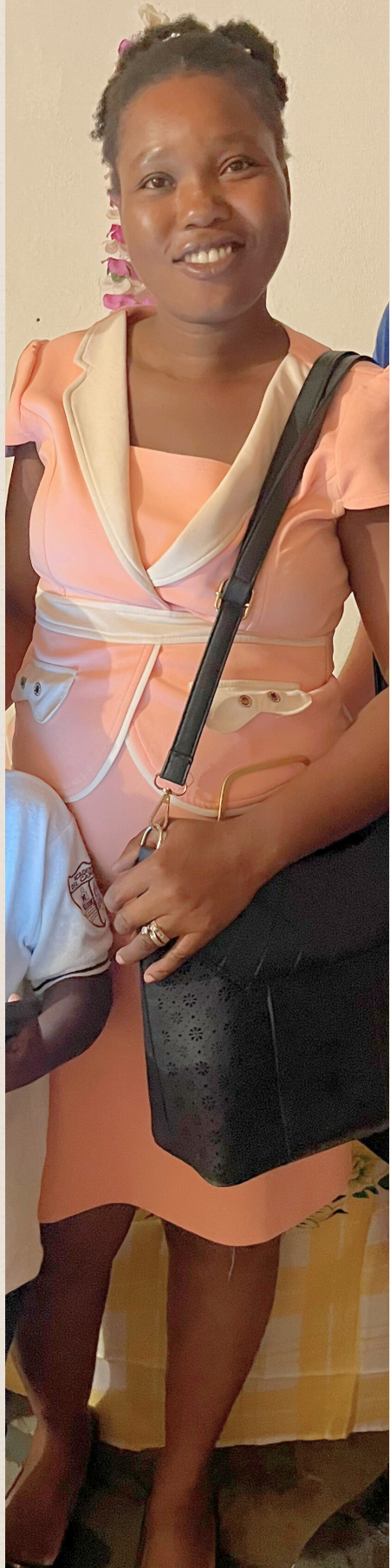
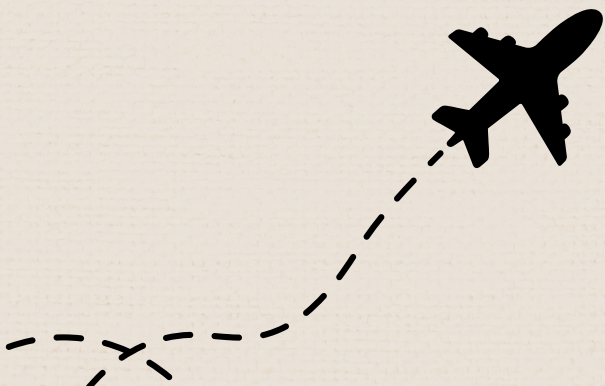

LETTER FROM THE CEO AND PRESIDENT

Dear Friends and Supporters,

It is with deep gratitude that I write to you on behalf of all of us here at Project Piti Pami. As we reflect on the past year, it is hard not to be thankful for what we have been able to accomplish in the face of continued challenges. At the root of our success, of course, are each of you. Plainly stated, without your financial support, none of what we do is possible. Every clinic and healthcare initiative, every partnership strengthened in Haiti is a direct result of your faithful support.

Your generosity was especially evident in the incredible success of our fundraising efforts in 2025. Our Hit the Links for Haiti golf scramble raised more than \$10,000, a milestone that reflects both the generosity of our supporters and the growing enthusiasm around our mission. In addition, we were thrilled to host our very first Hope for Haiti Benefit Dinner in November in Petoskey, Michigan. The evening raised over \$1,000, but more importantly it created space for meaningful conversations and new connections with members of the community who are eager to learn more about our work and how they might become involved in supporting it. In all, we raised a little over \$23,000 for the year. As we look toward the future, we are also exploring the creation of an endowment fund for 3P.



Our hope is that this fund will help establish long-term stability and financial security for our projects, allowing us to sustain and expand our healthcare initiatives in Haiti for years to come.

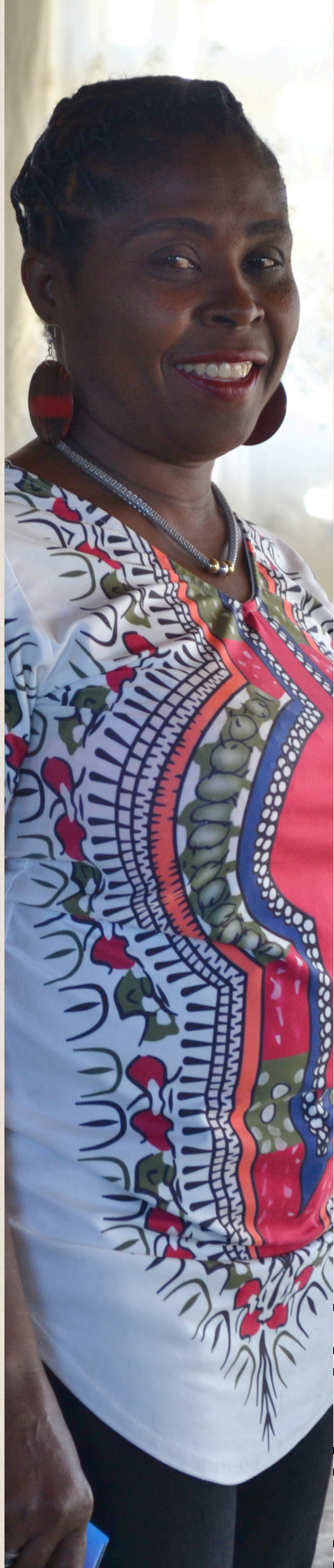
The year culminated in travel to Haiti in December, allowing us to reconnect with our HMP partners and to build new relationships with local leaders and communities. Travelling again with members of Partnership of Pastors International, Tom and Jesse were able to conduct interviews with local community members we have been serving, facilitated a mobile medical clinic, and built new connections on the ground with Haitian community leaders.

Despite ongoing struggles near the capital, we are encouraged by improvements in safety and accessibility in the northern regions of Haiti, where our operational focus has shifted. Jesse and Tom were able to travel safely into and out of Cap-Haïtien and visit several communities throughout the north without encountering safety concerns. Their time on the ground strengthened relationships and gave us valuable insight as we continue to develop our work in the region. Looking ahead, we hope to plan for our first independent nonprofit travel to Haiti since pre-COVID, tentatively scheduled for early 2027.



While the challenges facing Haiti remain significant, we move into 2026 with hope and optimism. As a nonprofit, we are learning to faithfully embrace rhythms of both work and rest—trusting that sustainable impact grows from thoughtful, steady commitment over time. We anticipate continued success in our efforts in fundraising, in building relationships, and in our advocacy for the people of Haiti. We look forward most of all to our continued partnership with each of you, knowing that your support is what continues to fuel this mission. It takes a village to make this work possible, and we thank you for choosing to be a part of ours.

2025 GOLF SCRAMBLE

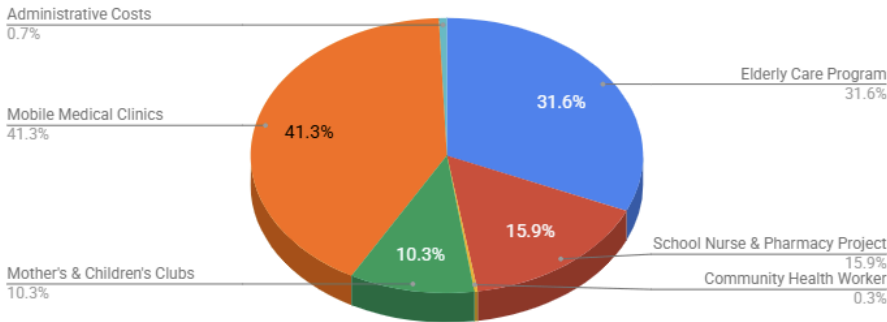

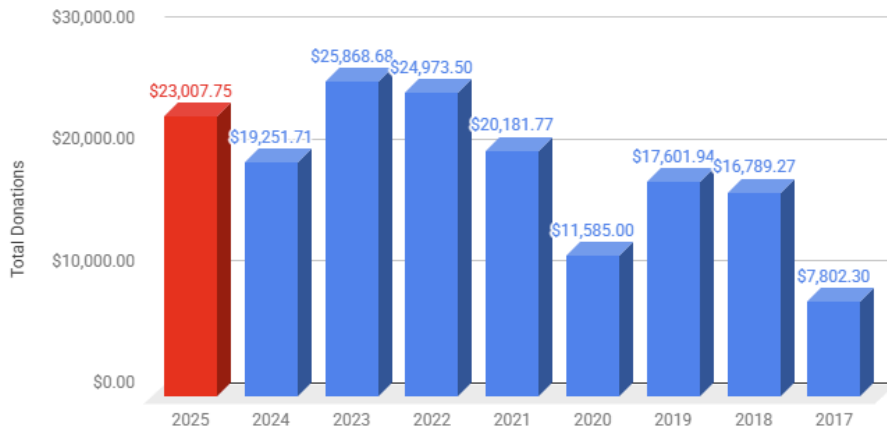


FINANCIAL SUMMARY OF 2025

We also started a new program for supporting school nurses and school pharmacy services in Ouanaminthe. Ouanaminthe has been one of the fastest growing cities in Ouanaminthe due to the number of people escaping from the gang violence and many Haitians are needing to start their lives over again in a new place so we are encouraged to know that these programs are able to help us fulfill our mission to serve "the least of these" (piti pami). Thank you for your continued support and we are looking forward to our continued partnership in 2026 and beyond!

For Project Piti Pami in 2025, we were very excited to diversify the types of programs that we support. 2025 was our first full year of supporting the Elderly Care Program in Ouanaminthe. This initiative was proposed by one of our Haitian partners, Pastor Jasmin, and he along with the Pastor's Association that he leads raise funds to support the health and wellbeing of elderly people within the community that no longer have family members around to support them. The Pastor's Association collects money and we matched the amount they collect to help provide nutritional support via food packages and multivitamins. This year we were able to support them with \$6,124 in matching funds. We are excited to further develop this program in the future to include health check-ups for these elderly people. Tom & I had the opportunity to meet with these Haitians in December and it was such a blessing to hear their story and know that our organization has been able to have a positive impact on their lives.

HAITI TRIP 2025



2025 has been an exciting year for Project Piti Pami. With our continuing partnership with the organization Partnership of Pastors International (PPI), Tom Taugher, our Chief Revenue Officer, and Jesse Place, our Chief Financial Officer, had the privilege to travel back to Haiti in December. They worked alongside PPI at their pastoral training seminars but were also able to help facilitate a medical clinic and check in on the water project in Ouanaminthe. Some of the most encouraging moments from this trip were meeting and interviewing various people who were receiving food and multivitamin packages from the Elderly and Widow Care Program we support. Tom and Jesse were able to establish new connections with local Haitian pastors and other leaders for future work in Haiti.

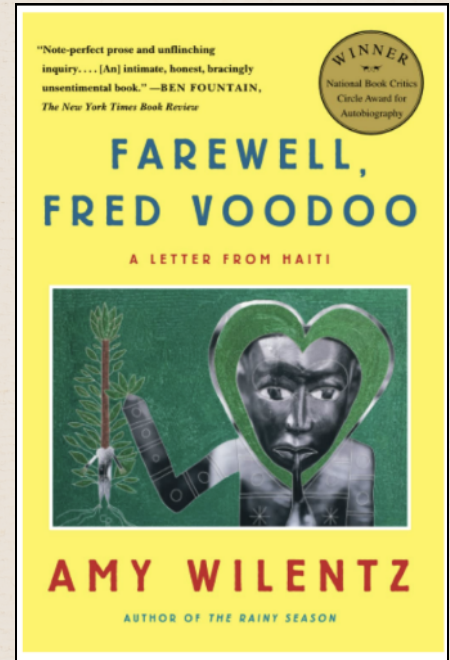
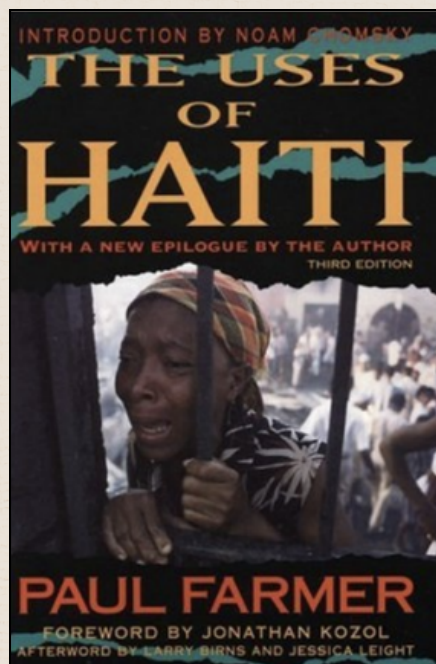
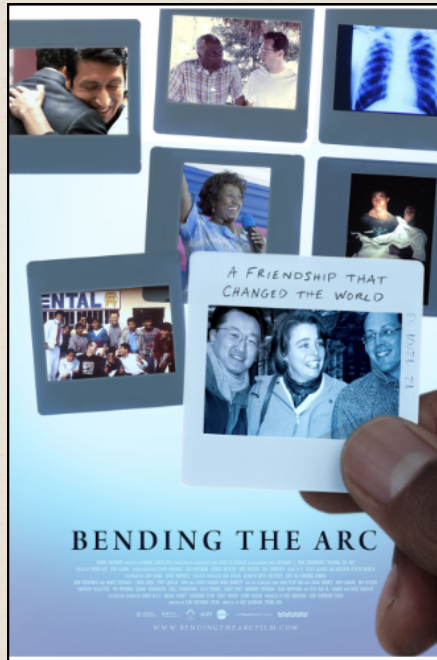
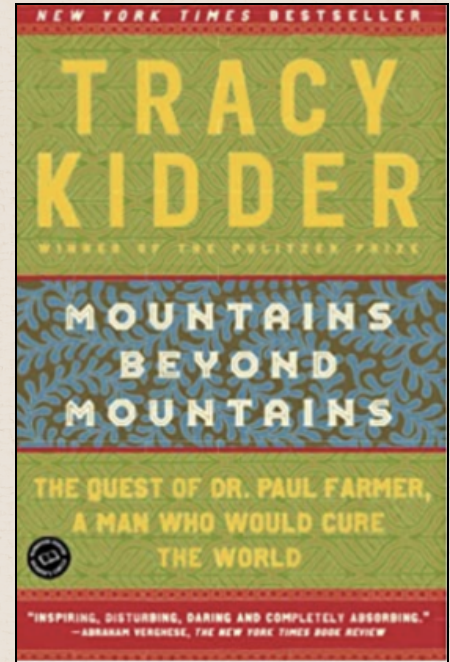
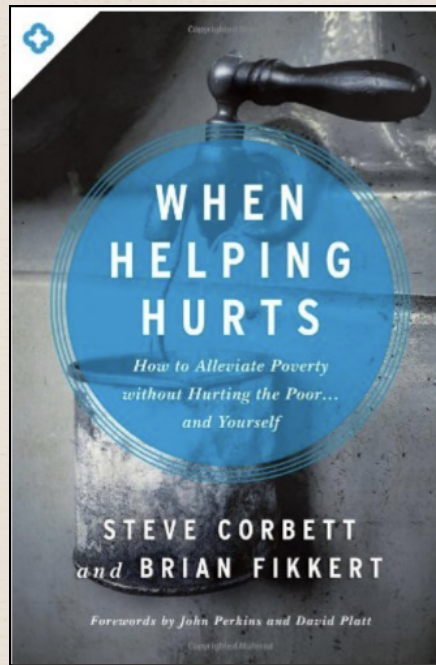
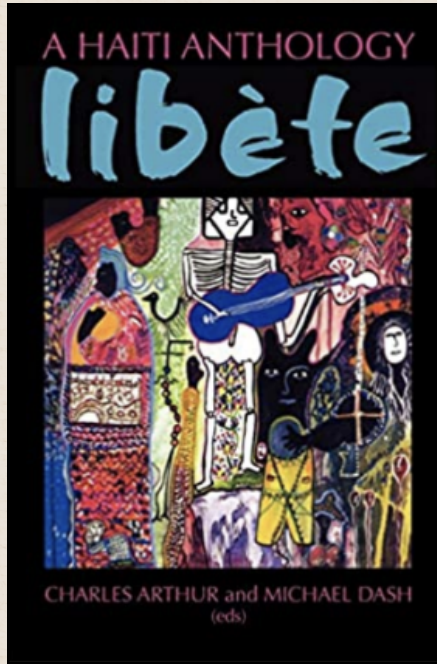


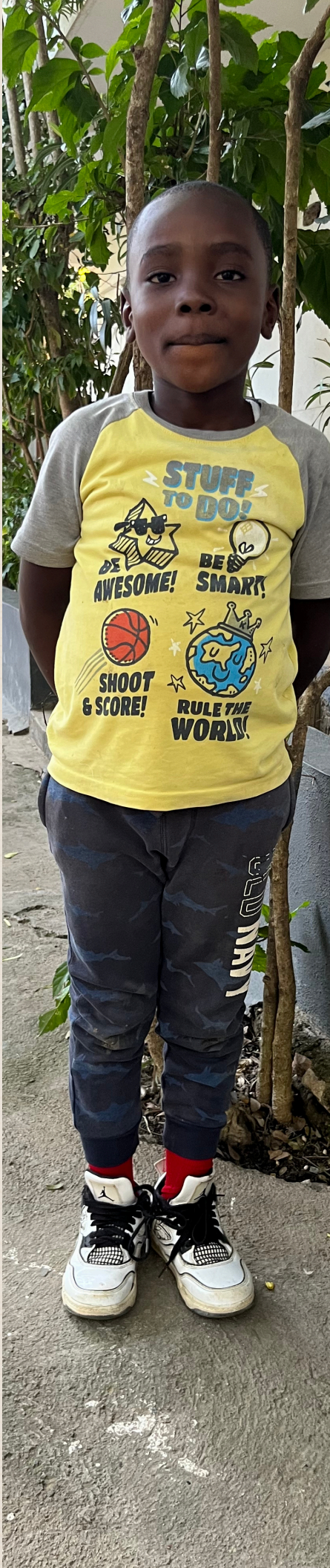
BENEFIT DINNER 2025

Because we have specific donors who cover our overhead costs, the funds donated to us are used only for supporting our projects in Haiti. Not a single person in our organization, from volunteer to CEO, receives any kind of financial compensation for their work. The costs of our annual trips to Haiti are funded entirely out-of-pocket by the volunteers who attend. For funds that are donated online through our secure PayPal system, Paypal receives 0.05% as credit card insurance, but the entirety of what remains from your donation makes its way to Haiti
