# Message from the CEO & President

---

## To our valued supporters,

In the year 2022, we celebrated our fifth birthday as a non-profit organization and took the opportunity to reflect on what we have learned in these first formative years. In our first few months as an infant organization, Project Piti Pami was little more than a collection of legal documentation, a website with a donation page, and a handful of enthusiastic graduate students with a shared vision.

We have seen members come and go, various projects succeed where others failed, multiple changes and pivots along the way as we learned what it meant to run a non-profit. How do we hold ourselves accountable to our donors and our partners? What does it take to win others over to our cause? And when the rubber meets the road, what does it mean to truly serve "the least of these"?

Since being founded in 2017, we have raised over \$100,000 collectively for our programs with Haiti Medical Project (HMP) and the communities we serve. For a small group of young professionals each with

Reflecting on the past year alone, 3P celebrated a number of key events. In March, a handful of our leadership team who are graduates of Saginaw Valley State University were nominated for the Distinguished Young Alumni Award in recognition of our work with 3P - incredibly encouraging, an honor, and brought the spotlight to our work and the people of Haiti in a new way. Later on in June, we hosted our second annual Hit the Links for Haiti Golf Scramble fundraiser, our most successful fundraising event to date at over \$15,000 raised, leading us to



full-time jobs in addition to our work with 3P, this is no small feat! We have hosted a number of large fundraising events and have connected with a significant number of individual donors along the way, several of whom have been with us from day one and remain to this day.

ultimately raise over \$24,000 for the fiscal year, our highest yet. We welcomed new faces throughout the year, including a few volunteers and our newest Administrative Director, and we laid the groundwork for a volunteer internship for college students that would ultimately be unveiled in 2023.

As we have learned is typical for this line of work, we also met a number of unprecedented challenges with clinics shifting operations to more remote regions that are generally safer for our partners to practice in. As we wait out this season of unrest, the HMP has shifted their focus to more preventative health projects including drilling wells for clean

water access and investing in education for new mothers - and we have shifted our financial priorities for 2023 to follow suit, in hopes that we will be able to resume our previous number of mobile clinics in the future.

HMP was also forced to relocate their headquarters from Croix-des-Bouquets (a small community adjacent to Port-au-Prince) to San Raphael several hours north, where it is currently relatively safe for our Haitian partners to continue working, but is, unfortunately, still unsafe for anyone who is obviously non-Haitian, further delaying our plans to return to Haiti and reunite with our friends



and partners. This has been a painful season as we find ourselves having not set foot physically in Haiti since December of 2018, following which our plans for 2019 travel were delayed by unrest following the presidential assassination on the heels of a devastating hurricane, and since 2020 delayed by COVID and the persistent political unrest that has followed and is still present currently.

As we look back on the path we have traveled, the things we have learned - often in the midst of unprecedented hardship - and the organization that we are today as a result of it all, my reflections are thus summed up. This work is equally difficult and essential. It is the hardest thing we have ever done, and the most rewarding thing we'll ever do. I am honored to be a part of it all. And I am eager for what is coming next. We hope, dear supporter, that you are too.

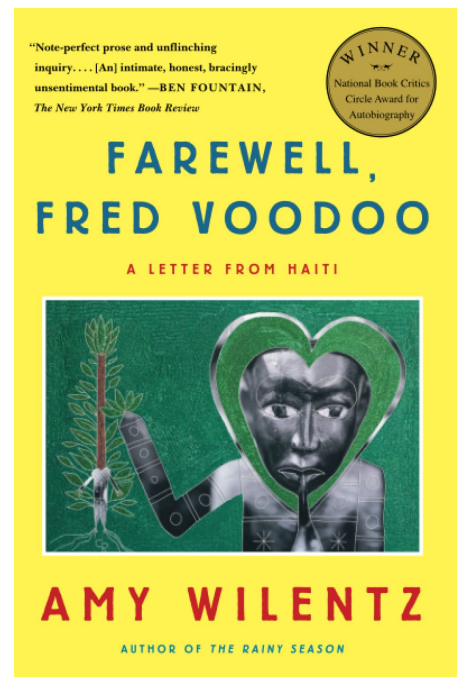
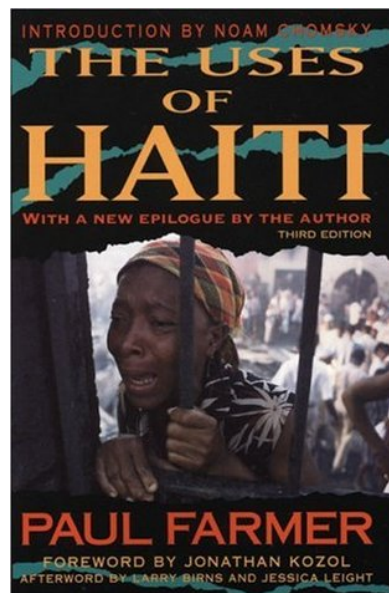
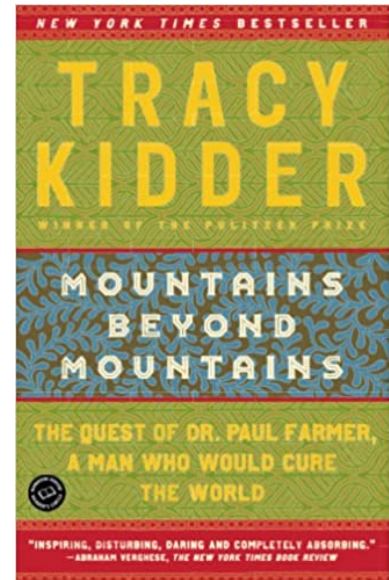
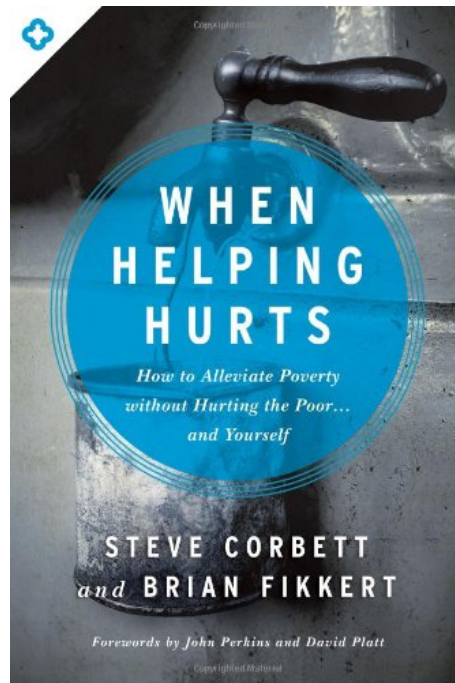
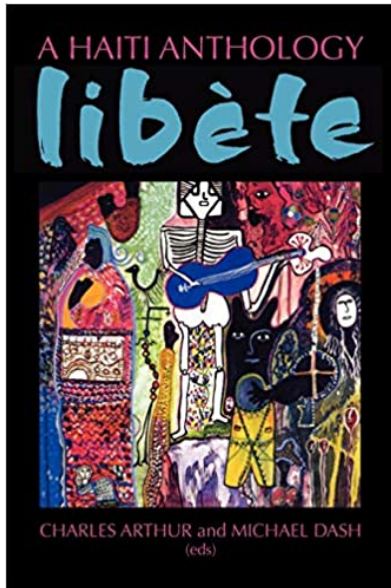


# Financial Summary: 2017-2022

Because we have specific donors who cover our overhead costs, the funds donated to us are used only for supporting our projects in Haiti. Not a single person in our organization, from volunteer to CEO receives any kind of financial compensation for their work. The costs of our annual trips to Haiti are funded entirely out-of-pocket by the volunteers who attend.

For funds that are donated online through our secure PayPal system, Paypal receives 0.05% as credit card insurance, but the entirety of what remains from your donation makes its way to Haiti
